The ceremony included 39 startup ventures, two social-enterprise institutions and three awareness groups. The Youth Fund supports youth with grants to better shape their ideas into successful ventures, after having successfully completed ideation boot camps and undergone extensive mentorship and coaching. Saudi Arabia contributes US\$ 2.5 million to support RH programmes

On 23 June, Saudi Arabia's King Saiman Humanitarian Ald & Relial Centre (Kspielia) announced a contribution of 1825 million to support UNFPA in continuing providing life-axing reproductive health services to the most vulnerable women and girls in 'hemen. The funding will help increase womens' and girls' access to reproductive health services through 15 health facilities and 50 community milwives in southern parts of the country. This support aims to reach more than 350,000 women and girls in the next 12 months, enable pregnant
